Youth can show in both the youth halter classes and halter classes. Both classes will need to be added on the entry form. For example, if you are showing a Suri Juvenile Female in both Halter and Youth Halter you will put class number "64" AND "129" on the entry form and pay accordingly.

ILR age restrictions will be followed when handling intact male llamas. Classes may be combined at show management discretion.

Halter Classes (cont'd) & Special Classes

Production Classes

137. Produce of Dam

In the Produce of Dam class, exhibitors enter two llamas who share the same dam. They do not need to share a sire. Judging is based on consistency of positive characteristics. Individual animals representing the dam in this class must be chosen and reported to the show clerk before the class begins.

138. Get of Sire

In the Get of Sire class, exhibitors enter three llamas who share the same sire. The 3 offspring must be out of at least 2 different dams. Judging is based on consistency of positive characteristics. Individual animals representing the sire in this class must be chosen and reported to the show clerk before the class begins.

139. Composite Class \$20

The purpose of the composite award is to recognize animals with both exceptional conformation and fleece characteristics. To qualify, the same animal must be in both a halter class (any division or age) and a fleece-on class (any division or age). Can you enter more than one llama? Absolutely!

140. Costume (All Ages) \$15

Costumes are judged on creativity and theme between handler and animal, amount of coverage and free hanging accessories, and the animals' willingness to accept coverage and move freely in a quiet and controlled manner.

142. Best Trio \$30

Make sure to "Showcase" your best three llamas for all to see - any age, any sex and any fiber type. Competing entries will be paired by a drawing ahead of the class and will run until only one farm is left. Cash Premiums will be paid. LIMIT ONE ENTRY PER FARM.

142. Jackpot Obstacle \$10

The name says it all. You can hit the jackpot and walk away with half of the proceeds in this class. Don't miss this high energy, fast paced FUN class that will allow you to show off your lama's performance skills and your strategic skills. The best "performance lama" does not usually win this class. It is not based on the normal judging system, but how many obstacles are completed with various point values during the time frame. You get to choose which obstacles to complete and in any order you want. You can complete each obstacle up to 3 times before having to move to something new. It is all about what your animals can do and how quickly you get them to do it. No need to worry about faults either. Limit of 2 lama entries per exhibitor.
